Connecting **1,500 volunteers** to local service through ChaffeeVolunteers.org

ChaffeeVOLUNTEERS.org is a onestop-shop connecting people who want to help with local organizations in search of volunteers. Those seeking to volunteer can search opportunities across the community that are a good fit for their interests and skill sets.

The portal offers a robust \$5,000 annual value to local nonprofit member organizations for just \$25/month. Organizations can access a full suite of tools to recruit, track, manage and communicate with their volunteers.

## Investing over \$350,000 through local grants to meet critical community needs

CCCF embraces a trust based philanthropy model as we seek to increase the capacity of our local nonprofit sector with much needed funding.

CCCF engages community review committees to ensure funds are invested in high impact organizations meeting critical local needs.

Thanks to our partnerships with the City of Salida, Bonfire Entertainment, Town of Buena Vista, Sangre de Cristo Electric Association and local donors, we work to empower the nonprofit sector through funding.

The Community Leaders Fellowship offers intensive and personalized guidance and support to nonprofit leaders seeking to solve a specific challenge at their organization.

The year long program joins CCCF's suite of capacity building resources including workshops, the Community Summit and individualized consultation services.

80 nonprofit leaders from 40 organizations received training & support from CCCF in 2023.
